The Romans Road

"for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" Romans 3:23. Romans Road begins with the truth that everyone needs salvation because all people have sinned. No one gets a free ride, because every person is guilty before God. We all fall short of the mark.

Set Apart in the Way We Think

A challenge we face in today's world is developing a biblical view of ourselves. We are prone to comparisons, which either elevate or depreciate ourselves considering the biblical ideal. In many cases, pride manifests by people thinking too highly of themselves (narcissism). Some have the opposite problem with a perilously low view of self- which is also biblically inadequate- which can cause depression and anxiety because they are out of spiritual imbalance.

When we develop a biblical view of ourselves, we are no longer self-absorbed or unnecessarily self-conscious. We begin to demonstrate the personal dignity and others-centered focus needed to serve one another. Paul built on this rejection of self-comparison by saying *"in lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves" Philippians 2:3*. When we embody this type of attitude, we exhibit a posture of serving others in the way God has equipped us. We recognize that God has given us a spiritual gift and the faith to use it, thus fulfilling our responsibilities to God through the body of Christ.
